Meeting held 17th February 2021

Ken then advised that the latest recipient is a dedicated and active member and summarised his roles within Greenmeadows Rotary. He invited Peter Thompson forward.

Ken explained that it was during Peter's time as President in the 2019/20 year that his real commitment and empathy towards the Club and its members really came to the fore. Peter worked tirelessly to keep the Club active and engaged. This was of course the year that the Covid 19 struck the world. It would have been very easy simply to "close" the Club down for the duration however Peter worked tirelessly to keep the Club active and engaged.

Peter put considerable hours and thought into ensuring the Club's members were both safe and connected. He was a frequent visitor to some of the Club's more elderly and maintained a constant phone connection with many others to ensure that they had all they needed during the lockdown period. He went far beyond what is accepted as the norm for Club Presidents.

Peter has always demonstrated the Rotary motto of "Service above Self" by his activities both within and outside the Club. He is a regular volunteer for all aspects of Rotary life and a regular at the likes of RYPEN, Dolbel plantings and Club fundraising activities. One aspect of his commitment is his willingness to help others who, through unexpected circumstances, require assistance. His regular and frequent assistance to these people is perhaps unequalled within the Greenmeadows Rotary.

President Frank then presented Peter with his PHF pin and certificate as members stood and applauded.

Ken again came forward and explained that the next recipient is someone who has clearly demonstrated, and continues to demonstrate, these Rotary ideals over an extended period. Even in school this person was showing leadership and innovation gaining awards in a variety of fields. In 1986 she was appointed a JP and must have been one



of the youngest JP's ever. In 1992 she was awarded a Palmerston North Civic award for her work with children's health and safety and wellbeing.

He Invited Mary Anne Eyles and Garth to the stage.

The Eyles moved to Hawkes Bay in 1993 where Mary Anne continued her JP work and served on the HB JPs association. She was President from 2004 to 2007, a ministerial trainee and a teacher/mentor of provisionally appointed JPs and is still a practising JP.

In 2012 Mary Anne was appointed onto the HB Ethics Committee which she served on until it was disbanded in 2018. Also in 2012 she joined the Red Cross Napier Branch and is still an active member. A committee member from 2012 and Branch president from 2014 – 2020 (a maximum 6 year term) Responsible for the management t of volunteers (over 200) and coordinating the running of the Red Cross shop. As Area Chairperson her role is to coordinate the activities of the Eastland Area including 3 day courses for "at risk" children in the Gisborne region.

Mary Anne is a person well worthy of a Paul Harris Award.

President Frank then presented Mary Anne with her PHF pin and certificate as members again stood and applauded.
