is next week at the War Memorial Centre. A list has been circulated. He suggested members might like to eat before they go as limited food will be served at the end of the awards presentation. He also asked members attending to take their name badges home with them tonight. Partners are very welcome. No charge but cash bar will be available.

**Directors Meeting** – tonight at Gill's.

Guest speaker – Brendan Walker was introduced by Graeme Muir.

Brendan thanked the club for the opportunity to speak and explained he comes from Gisborne, has worked in Australia and Hawkes Bay and is currently the Regional Manager for Hawkes Bay and Gisborne. He is responsible for 3 sites with 60 staff and trucks, the third largest of the company's operations.

The company have their own landfill, hazardous waste and tyre recycling facilities. They were originally Australian owned but now owned by Chinese.

Landfill is still NZ's main means of waste disposal especially since China stopped importing recyclable materials and other Asians countries put restrictions on imports driving down the price. NZ lacks scale for reprocessing a number of recyclables

Emphasis is now changing to make people accountable for the waste they generate and to minimise the waste they create with financial deterrents including government waste disposal levies and Emissions Trading Scheme. Waste Management are also encouraging their clients to reduce waste and have adopted 20 goals for sustainability.

Concern was expressed by some members that increasing the cost of disposing of waste create more fly tipping which Brendan acknowledged.
