EIT Awards Night

Another very successful evening at the Greenmeadows Rotary and EIT HB Trade Training Awards held in the Napier War Memorial Centre. President Frank opened with an outline of what Rotary is and does, and noted that this is the 43rd year these Awards have been held.

MC for the evening was Todd Rogers, Head of School Trades and Technology. Fred Koenders, Executive Dean of the Faculty of Commerce and Technology acknowledged the tremendous ongoing support Employers and Industry gave to EIT, its'



programmes, and its' students. It was pleasing to see that a number of employers were also recipients of these Awards in the past. The Trades area has an increase of 100 students in 2021.



Guest Speaker Hamish White, founder and CEO of NOW stated he has employed over 20 EIT graduates over the last ten years. He worked in NZ and Australia and his vision was to build a company which would create jobs for Hawke's Bay. This year he has created 34 new positions and his Company NOW is the fastest growing Telecommunication company in NZ. He urged the students to be unrelenting in their passion and vision, to trust their intuition and don't forget to invest in basic human skills. Putting aside academic qualifications, a positive attitude is everything.

At the end of the apprentice awards, President Frank presented the Mike Davis Memorial Cup and a cheque for \$2000 to Phillip Murray an Electrical student.

industry reps to have the importance of celebrating these apprentices achievements reaffirmed and the importance that Rotary plays in this.
