Frank showed a large format cheque provided gratis by Napier Signs to represent the donation from Alan's cycle ride to Australasian Rotary's centennial project, Give Every Child a Future. The "cheque" was used for a special presentation at the District 9930 Conference.

JR McKenzie Trust – Ken Braines from Stortford Lodge Rotary advised that the Trust has considerable funds available for helping needy students at school. District 9930 was initially focused on the Waikato and working with Government and NGO's involved with youth but more recently have been working directly with

Guest Speaker – Ruby Kaotira from Tamatea High School who had been sponsored by the club to attend the 2 week Rotary National Science and Technology Forum at Auckland University spoke on her experience. Ruby thanked the club for sponsoring her to the forum where she met like-minded students from all over NZ. They attended numerous lectures, visited Massey University, AUT and Auckland School of Medicine but also had time for recreational activities. As a result of the forum she is now looking to study Health Science at either Otago or Auckland.

District Conference – Penny, Alan ad Jenny each gave a brief report on different aspects of the conference.

The 2021 District Conference was held at Toitoi Events Centre in Hastings, 21st -23rd May 2021 Hosted by District Governor Grant Spackman and his Havelock North Rotary Club and attended by 350 registered Rotarians. The conference theme "Bridging the Gap".

Friday evening meet and greet was held on the stage in the Opera House, showcasing the wonderful recent restoration of this beautiful venue to district attendees.

After the official morning welcome the Saturday speaker lineup included presentations by NBHS/NGHS Interact, Mutes (a band from Auckland with disabilities), Adrian Gregory - lifting the lid on youth suicide, a live zoom with Stephanie Woodard - Seven Woman Project in Nepal, Ben Evans - Taekwon Do, Dr Robbie Francis Watney - disrupting ableism while bridging the gap, Professor Paul Spoonley - a new New Zealand, Frances Benge - Sir Bob and his Rotary Legacy 50 years on.

The evening dinner and entertainment theme was 'midlife crisis' whilst our club scratched our heads on what to wear, the ladies got President Frank into tails with a cap and sexy sunglasses to parade him as their Greenmeadows 'toy boy' was a fun night with lots of fellowship and dancing.
