#### Meeting 28 July 2021

**President Jenny** opened the meeting with a welcome to the partners who accompanied members; now regular visitor (potential member) Natalya Latysheva; & guest speakers Maxine Boag and Barb Abbott. The order of the evening altered to accommodate our Raapa Wha – a visit elsewhere for our meal.

Guest Speakers Councillor Maxine Bag and Chairperson Barb Abbot gave us an outline of the Tangata Maraenui Trust (TTM), an organisation they were obviously very passionate about. They reported having had a very busy year, visited Parliament twice (lobbying) establishing a community hub, dealing with traffic control, Community police, Maori Wardens, working on a community park and community nursery. They also arranged assistance to help residents gain driver's licences. A Neighbourhood "clean-up" (last spring) brought residents together (had a BBQ) trailers collected rubbish and recycling was promoted. They work with a rather low budget of \$8000 from the council. They seem to be doing a great job & could use assistance. See their pamphlet attached.
