Inducting new members



The advertised five three minute speakers turned into four (or scribe fell asleep) and they were -


Geoff Bibby who talked of his difficulty getting up in the morning, struggling to dress, his morning coffee walk and dodging cyclists. He then got serious and told of his "real interests" like the Discussion Group, Intellectual Book Club and going to Taupo with a Kiwi egg which hatched – later I think.

Curly Carpenter a confessed "Petrol Head", talked about alternative fuels, petrol and hydroden creating electricity for axels or wheels, charging these things and the advantages of having power when you want it. (I suspect he is going to train as an electrician soon so he can "reinvent" himself. Scribe)

Fred Staples described the "myths" of climate change and said he defends farmers (for some reasons).
