Walk-a-thon – Kelvin Winnie reminded us of the two sheets doing the rounds for us to enter the number of kms we were doing in our training (total so far 854km, enough to get us from North Cape to a golf club near Hunterville) and the other sheet for entering our chosen time to walk (or stagger) on the day.





Foundation – Graeme Muir announced that they had gained a District Grant of \$3100 for Camp Kaitawa. (This is a benefit from our earlier donations to the Foundation, half of which is used globally and half returned for use in district projects.)

Bob Morrison thanked all members for their messages and visits during his recent spell in hospital, making particular reference to Welfare Office Stu and his wife Heather.



We were reminded of the theatre evening next Tuesday evening and the Thai Lotus event on Wednesday.

Three Minutes Speaker – Geoff Bennett gave a real life account of "going overseas" in recent months, leaving "Fortress Cindy" and travelling to Calgary. He described the trials and tribulations of medical insurance, vaccinations, making it (somewhere) within 72 hours, MIQ (maybe three days in Vancouver and 11 in Calgary) and how good NZ was having booked in May for a September return. They had 14 fun filled days at Jet Park in Hamilton. Returning was good (as long as you don't catch covid) and after all that, he reckons he could go anywhere.

GUEST SPEAKER

Liz Wright, a member of the Te Awamutu Rotary Club and the District Interplast Chair for the past four years addressed us by Zoom. She described, with the aid of photographs, that the organisation was a partnership of Rotary and the Royal College of Surgeons in NZ and Australia. The surgeons travel (on invitation) to the Pacific, operate and train local staff as they do so. Some of the photographs were startling to say the least and members could see easily just how much this activity meant to the patients and their families. The "Before and After" photos were



almost unbelievable. Currently, due to covid-19, much of the assistance is given by webinars. Finance comes 20% from Rotary, 18% from Australian Government and much from big corporations and individuals.

Interplast – repairing bodies and rebuilding lives - in the Asia Pacific Region. (They could use our help.)



Interplast is a small charitable organisation started by Rotary in 1983 through a partnership with the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons. Rotary continues to be crucial in both governance and support from clubs and Districts throughout Australia and New Zealand.

The Constitution designates Rotary members of the Company, the Board of Directors and the Rotarian Committee of 9 Past District Governors.

Steve Gillum - Thanked the speaker, commenting on his amazement at the complexity of the activities (a thought shared by us all) and of a personal experience.
