President Jenny also reflected on the impact COVID restrictions placed on our fundraising efforts with the Directors agreeing that End Polio Now, Emergency Kits and RYLA were all going to have to be forfeited. However:

- Reducing the Plate Debate prize by \$1,250 enabled a donation to End Polio Now
- Science School didn't go ahead but we will use that money for RYLA (for which we already have an applicant)
- Art Deco weekend may mean we can donate to the Emergency Kits or Shelter Boxes
- A \$3,250 Rotary Foundation grant will be matched to use in the Camp Kaitawa renovations
- With the help of all club members through the Walk-a-thon, Megan Harris, auctions, raffles, Mark Dickerson – we can make a sizeable donation toward vaccinations for children and young women across the South Pacific

Maraenui Clean Un 20th December

The organisers need helpers (and trailers) to be at EIT Learning Centre, 18-20 Bledisloe Road, Maraenui (in the shopping centre)

People who want rubbish picked up will be told:

- Must be home for the pickup
- Must have items ready *outside* for easy access (helpers should not be entering homes)
- All dogs to be safely tied up
- Any large items e.g. whiteware to be specified

Rubbish is to be taken to Bestall Street (note the one-way system in place). Māori wardens will help unload.

There will be two piles of rubbish; one for compacting and the other for metal.
