A suggestion was made that those who didn't make it in person might still be able to participate via Zoom and this option will be explored further.

### <u>Guest Tour Guide around Waitangi Regional Park – Garth Eyles</u>

A group of twenty three, including partners, pulled into the car park on a quiet and windless evening. Split into two groups with the smaller group taking a short walk through the front plantings to the east and back to the celestial compass (Ātea a Rangi Star Compass).

The majority were in the second group headed west. Under the road and rail bridges, through the long grass and up onto the stop bank to see the 7ha Horseshoe Wetland constructed in 2002. At the frequent stops Garth explained how the wetland was developed with a multiagency approach and a huge input by volunteers. The many species of birds and plants were



identified, or misidentified, and the many questions expertly answered. Plenty of swans, Canadian geese and native plants. Further around the semi-circular stop bank was the recently completed 18ha Waikahu Wetland with its complement of birds, including spoonbills. Back under the rail and road



bridges to the front area closest to the fertiliser works, past the recent plantings and along the coastal margin to the celestial compass - the Māori traditional navigation training site.

Once both groups had joined up at the celestial compass Garth gave a wrap up.



Members were impressed by the amount of work involved, particularly the plantings. A lovely way to finish off a Rotary meeting with thanks to Garth and Alan for organising it!
