Meeting 2nd March 2022

Meeting Chair Bryan Matthews welcomed members on behalf of President Jenny and the Artex Committee and thanked Geoff Bennett for his generous shout celebrating the birth of his grandson Jackson.

The **Opening Thought** by Denise Primrose was one of the better reflections we've heard in a long time – it was certainly topical:

"When we were last sitting around these tables just a week ago:

- We were only speculating on Putin's next move as Russian troops amassed on the border of Ukraine
- Omicron daily numbers stood at 3,000 per day and now they've topped 23,000 per day
- The occupation at Parliament was, at that stage, into its 16th day and today has culminated in rioting and fires as Police move to reclaim a large portion of Wellington's CBD
- MIQ and home isolation has been abandoned for homecoming New Zealanders

A great deal has changed in the past seven days. We will all have our own views which will give us a great deal to reflect on and discuss over tonight's dinner no doubt"

President's Notices: On behalf of President Jenny the following notices were presented:

- Lynne Gibson advised that the earplugs on the tables are a reminder that 3rd March is World Hearing Day. The theme for this year is 'To hear for life, listen with care'
- Garth Eyles circulated lists of environmental projects which the club had participated in over the
 years and asked members to add or elaborate on the content toward a stocktake of such
 projects by the District Environmental Committee.
- Bryan Matthews advised that the next Artex was planned for June (Matariki Weekend).
 Planning was fully accommodating of potential COVID-related scenarios and a second booking had been made for October as a contingency (provided no one else booked in it the meantime).

3 Minute Speaker Peter Thompson introduced the Stella Awards – so named after American Stella Liebeck, at the time 79 years old, who was awarded \$160,000 in compensatory damages and \$2.7 million in punitive damages because she spilled a scalding cup of McDonalds coffee on her lap causing third-degree burns. Just happens that she was in the passenger seat of a car holding the cup between her knees. McDonalds and Liebeck settled out of court but the Stella Awards have since been pubished annually to the most laughable legal claims such as:

- Kathleen Robertson of Austin, Texas, was awarded \$780,000 by a jury after breaking her ankle tripping over a toddler who was running amuck inside a furniture store. The owners of the store were understandably surprised at the verdict, considering the misbehaving child was Ms. Robertson's son.
- Terrence Dickson of Bristol, Pennsylvania, was exiting a house he finished robbing by way of the garage.
