3 Minute Speaker

Curly Carpenter spoke on the recent Easter weekend which for him, began with a normal "look after the grandchildren" occasion, happy events, visiting pools on the parade, a lot of fun and by Monday they had covid in the house! He thought a bus had hit him, headaches, three days in bed, NetFlix and (several RATs done) now out the other side! In that light, he had a carton of RATs devices and handed them out to the Rotarians who had been scared by his talk. In an introduction, Pete Thompson said he did not need one (i.e. an intro) that he was energetic and would tell us about "The Mother Road", "Main Street America" or "Route 66". Alan (with the aid of a brilliant power point – attributed to Liz) did then tell us of this historic road in the US and which runs from (the birthplace of Rotary) Chicago to Santa Monica in California. This is a distance of some 2,448 miles and not having the money to take a Greyhound bus while there in 2019, he rode the road on his bike (of course). He told us that Henry Ford had built the cars and that Cyrus Avery, the father of the road, had built it! It grew a lot during World Wars, spawned a song ("Get Your Kicks on Route 66") which was followed with 116 episodes of a TV series of the same name. What was once a (THE) main road, has now been bypassed by interstate highways. Highlights of the journey included, the Road Kill Café ("You kill it we grill it!") statues, horse and cart murals, Cadillac Ranch (buried cars) Crazy Café, VW ranch, Elmer's Bottle Ranch, losing his passport - and much more. He started on a street corner in Chicago and finished at the Santa Monica Pier in California. At 69 years of age, he biked Route 66 in 63 days. 69 – 66 – 63. Phew!!
