Programme (Apology - not Hohepa Homes as earlier stated; covid and mental collisions caused a misreport)

Jenny Pearce Manager for the Citizens Advice Bureau (CAB) Napier addressed us (with a power point) on her organisation. She is originally from Summerset in UK and in recognition of Rotary, she was sporting a Paul Harris Fellowship badge that she had been awarded by Rotary there before coming to NZ. She had a background with disadvantaged children, Aged Concern before coming to CAB. She thought she may have addressed our club about five years ago, she recognised the CAB founder (1980s) Kerry Duncan (apparently known to many) who after 30 years with the organisation died two days after retiring. CAB receive Council support (pay for 30 hours a week for her and six hours for one other). That is around 40% of their funding and the rest is gained by applying for various grants.



They visit several major organisations in the city to offer help and are assisted by Volunteers "who are too young to grow old." They aim to provide "free,

impartial & confidential information, advice & support aiming at helping people help themselves." They deal with family matters, renting and flatting, immigration, and income support, and have JP access to witness documents. A lot of training goes into training their volunteers who are learning and developing all the time. They are accessible by phoning up or calling in and in that respect, they have occupied several venues (Plunket Room, Raffles, Hastings Streets, rear of Warehouse) and now at Bower House, 18 Bower Street. Usually on duty are Jenny Pearce and one other plus two volunteers.

Alan White thanked Jenny and commented that his Liz was a (very well trained) volunteer as well as being on the Board. He described their mantra as "Supplying the time to listen!"
