Guest Speaker

Tama Hutana was briefly introduced as he battled with the technology before activating his power point and coming to the rostrum to tell us (first in te reo and then English) that he was HB born and bred (Kahungunu) described his home, marae and family background. Unable to get a video to "play" for us he said we could go to TVNZ on demand and look up "The Addiction Machine." Then, aided by his power point, he subjected us to an addiction quiz which seemed to show that we had better be very careful with our spare money! Never-the-less he made some very good points about the dangers of gambling and showed some staggering figures as to the numbers involved (in people & money). He gave examples of "harmful gambling" and described the services and support that are provided by Gambling Recovering Service HB, this particularly included "banning yourself." Tama also told us that 2% of the "gambling profits" went towards counteracting the addiction, through groups like his. He opened up for questions and these were numerous.
