There was a belated reminder that next Wednesday would be the final evening to receive for food parcels.

#### The Three Minute Speaker

Club Environmental Officer Garth Eyles presented his final report for the year and (after defeating technical problems with the power point) said as it was winter we should be staying in town and walking around the likes of Dolbel Reserve. He then went on to give us something of a history of the reserve saying the Dolbel Brothers arrived in 1855 (I think) subdivided a portion of Taradale land and donated about 18 hectares as a reserve (maybe around 1870). It is part of what is now more than 700 hectares of reserves in Napier. It seems there are always developments and recently a new Kauri track. It is easy to get lost. Go clockwise so as not to get trapped! Fabulous views when you reach the top, only spoiled by people building mansions there! Taradale Rotary have been involved with the reserve since 2000 and GM since 2005.

Sergeant Wal Drayton drew Raffle No. 1 which was claimed by Brian Hall. He then fined the scribe for getting Wal's duty wrong on the roster (Wal may find he is on duty a lot from now!!). He then caught those at scribes table, those who had been to the bar, someone who had something to do with Mark's chair and anyone who had not paid by then! ## **Guest Speaker**

Kelvin Winnie introduced John Dyer, Security Coordinator for the Red Cross. He has been with the organisation for 20 years (previously been in the military for the same amount of time). Aided by power point John described how there were several parts of Red Cross all over the world and the International Federation over the top of that. He was on the international board of the organisation. Earlier this year he spent five weeks in Ukraine representing the International Red Cross. He told how it took over

50 hours to get there, though had a big layover somewhere and finally

awoke with covid. So he rested up for a while.

He described Ukraine as about 1400km across, i.e. the distance from Invercargill to Palmerston North but in area is about 2 ½ times the size of NZ. The devastation is mainly in the east. He noted the Lviv was quiet and tidy but then bombed. Seven million people were evacuated, mainly to the west of Ukraine. He described 70 people living in a school – with not a lot of plumbing! Cash and vouchers were the most useful things to disperse to evacuees. In his role as assessing risks he noted the most serious one was the serious road

crash rate! Thus the principle security concerns for Red Cross were – road crashes, their emblem, chemicals, armed conflict and their medical response.

Fred Staples thanked John for his unique generosity in improving the world.

Parting Thought from Pres Jenny (practising for her role outside of presidency!) "Although no one can go back and make a brand new start, anyone can start from now and make a brand new ending" (This surely does not relate to the past year.
