ENVIRONMENT

'Save the Dotterels - Hawke's Bay' - Update

This coming nesting season, the 'Save the Dotterels, Hawke's Bay' project has over 30 volunteers who have agreed to be 'dotterel minders'. The 'Save the Dotterels, HB' working group, consisting of passionate locals, have made great progress with obtaining some funding to purchase materials to rope off nests, Hi Viz vests, the printing of a pamphlet and trapping equipment.

The volunteers will principally be identifying and monitoring nests and recording the data. This season we will be concentrating on two locations – one at Bayview and one at Clive. Two information workshops are being held this month for the volunteers – the Bayview workshop is on the 31st July. At the two locations it is the banded dotterel that nests at both sites although NZ Dotterels nest at other locations in Hawke's Bay. NZ Dotterels are a small shore nesting bird endemic to NZ and Banded Dotterels are endemic breeders in NZ. As you can imagine, these birds face many threats during the nesting season with vehicles on beaches, dogs off leads and other predators such as cats, rats, stoats and hedgehogs.
