STAND IN SPEAKER SPOKE OF HIS SPECIAL DAD

Bryan Matthews volunteered at very short notice and spoke about his Father, who was the Napier City Council Electrical Engineer, a very bright spark indeed.

Following schooling in Christchurch, he followed his Father as an Engineer. After working in the Islands, Bryans Father was appointed NCC Engineer in 1956, retiring for the first time in 1976, and being asked to go back for two years after 2 years of temporary retirement. His objective was to have all the then City having underground electricity before he retired. He achieved 90%, then 100% after his second stint in the job. His methods and customised tools, were copied in several overseas cities, including San Francisco. He was against the siting of the Redclyffe substation, and built a line to / from the Port, which in an emergency, could be connected to a ship to generate electricity for the City. The line is still in use. (The theory being that an interisland ferry would come through to provide the generation – yeah right!)

He was progressive in many ways, and wrote papers, and presented

them at Conferences

overseas.
