WHAT DO YOU KNOW ABOUT THE OLYMPICS?

Neil Smith Introduced Nigel Avery by referring to the Sydney Olympics, the Commonwealth Games, and the wine trade and said that if you knew all this you could be a "Chef de Mission."

ligel then took the stand, pretended he had the wrong power point, and having thus gained our attention, mesmerized us for the next twenty minutes, beginning with something about a bob sled – the weight, friction (jewelers polish) and winning by 2/100ths of a second! He described the "Performance Support Team" and referred to budget, pride, respect, integrity, leadership and excellence. He then



went on to tell us of the importance and impact of the Haka to welcome our various teams on their arrival. He described the sheer size and the amount of walking between buildings and the dining room (which seated 4000 athletes!)

With photos he showed the various stadiums around the Eifel tower in Paris and told us that the opening ceremony would not be in a stadium but on the river! Many athletes will travel between venues by boat and many teams will be accommodated outside their village but nearer their own venues. He has been to Paris twice already (March and July) and will be there again in February – for the games in July – August. Three containers of equipment will be sent there. Our team with have 180 - 220 athletes and around 200 support staff. In the last three games the NZ team has continued to do better each time and so we do well for our small population.

At question time Nigel answered many queries, including that the Para-Olympics will follow two weeks after the main event and in saying thanks Brian Peploe conceded we were not using Avery wine but asked if he might return later to tell us the outcome at the Paris games.
