Speaker

ntroduced by Les Mockford, the speaker was Kimberley Moody, Communications Manager at Pan Pac Pulp & Paper Mill. Her Topic

was *Rising Above a Crisis* and was supported by a superb Power Point presentation.

Operating for over 50 years, she told us the mill currently exports to 30 countries and puts \$800 million annually into the NZ economy with 430 staff employed in Hawkes Bay and Milburn in Otago. A robust actioned Crisis Management Plan that was initiated in 2018 and proved to be vital to the recovery when they were seriously affected by Cyclone Gabrielle last year.





With People, Planet, Prosperity and Partnerships as Pan Pac's main priorities, this was invaluable when Cyclone Gabrielle did \$300 million damage to plant and business continuity. Some 40% of the pulp mill was salvageable and new electrical replacement and modern equipment enabled Pan Pac to buy energy efficiency. All of the staff were retained and helped with the recovery of the mill.

She also told us of the Urban Kakabeak Project, Pan Pac Environmental Trust and Project Whiti, all of which support local resilient initiatives. Pan Pac is a highly respected business in our region and it is great to see it has become operational again post Cyclone Gabrielle.

Kimberley was thanked by Frank Heuser.




A RANDOM RHYME
