NAPIER'S 150TH BIRTHDAY – HOW WE GET READY

Kelvin then introduced Bevan Trotman who is the Project Manager employed by the Napier City Council for the 150 Years of Napier events celebrating the anniversary when Napier became a borough. We saw a video from the Napier Youth Council which is local school student leaders highlighting what they like about Napier including the multicultural diversity, ocean and open spaces.



There are at least 10 events planned commencing on 4th October with emphasis on history, fun and colour ranging from gala cocktail party to free events such as Tremains Whanau Fest 150 at Anderson Park on 30th November ending with a 150th Christmas Parade and Concert on 7th December.

Napier's Sister Cities representatives from Canada and China will also be attending the special commemoration Service on 28th November 2024.

To mark Napier's 150th, the city is getting its own edition of Hasbro's classic boardgame Monopoly.
