Whilst at school, he badly wanted to be a Traffic Officer – riding around Gisborne on motorbikes "doing nothing" ...... But as he was too young, he went to Waiouru and joined the Army. There he specialised in firefighting, transferring through Burnham, Linton and back to Waiouru. Flying into Christchurch the day after their earthquakes, Mike described the scenes as a picture out of George Orwell's books. In Chch he managed 120 full time staff and 160 volunteers.

Mike has been through three Rotary Clubs, initially Upper Hutt, then one in Christchurch (Otokaro), back to Upper Hutt, and now Greenmeadows. He is a Past President and Paul Harris Fellow. Mike enjoys fishing, and look for the glow in the sky at Christmas - as he decorates his property with Christmas lights.
